

PUBLIC INQUIRY ANNOUNCEMENT

Location: Rue Josaphat 76, 1030 Schaerbeek

On October 1st, 2021, the people of Rue Josaphat 76 filed in a complaint at The Administrative Department of the Council of Worms to address the problem of the ever growing population of worms, beetles and termites. According to the report the bugs were eating away all their furniture, contaminating their foods and destroying their houses.

The Council of Infestations took up the case, and ordered a priest to excommunicate the worms, beetles and termites and send them to a vacant parcel on the backside of Rue Josaphat 76. There, no-one is to be bothered by their tiny but abundant existence and they can live as they please.
